

How to fill out Form V6 — Odometer Disclosure Statement

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Alaska · written against Form V6 (Rev 08/2025), issued under 2 AAC 92.220 and 49 CFR Part 580, the state regulation and the federal rule the form cites together on its own first line

A one-page substitute for a block that is already printed on your title, and the form exists for exactly one situation: the certificate's own odometer section is missing, unusable or already used. The V6 says so itself - if the odometer disclosure section is not available or not used on the vehicle's title or Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin, this form may be completed and must accompany the transaction. If your certificate has a clean certification block, use it and leave this alone. What makes the V6 worth reading anyway is the list printed across its foot, because that list is the current Alaska exemption rule, and three of the Division's own web pages still print the superseded one.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank Form V6 from the Alaska Division of Motor Vehicles, Department of Administration at <https://dmv.alaska.gov/media/0jtfjcow/v6.pdf?f=alaska-v6.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Your full legal name	Name including suffix, as the face of the certificate has it. Watch out: This is the name the buyer's application will be read against. If the title says a maiden name and the licence says a married one, the packet needs an explanation before it needs this form.
2	YOU	Your address	Street, city, state and zip on the single seller address line. Watch out: Give the address the Division already holds for you. A new address here and an old one on the registration is one more thing for the counter to reconcile.
3	YOU	The vehicle identification number	Copied from the certificate into the long box, then checked against the vehicle. Watch out: This form travels loose. The VIN is what stops it being filed against the wrong car, so it matters here more than it does on paper that is stapled to the title.
4	YOU	The odometer reading	Whole miles, exactly as the instrument shows them, in the box marked Miles. Watch out: Read it in daylight with the ignition on rather than from memory. A wrong figure recorded on a title cannot be corrected afterwards, and the Division's own advice on the reading is not to guess.
5	YOU	The two warning boxes, both left empty	One for a reading in excess of the odometer's mechanical limits, one for a reading that is not the actual mileage. Neither is ticked on a working, honest clock. Watch out: If one of them is true, tick it and say so in the advert as well. A buyer who finds out at the counter walks away, and by then you have handed over the title.
6	YOU	Sign and date	Your signature and the date, on the lines directly under the reading. Watch out: Sign it in front of the buyer with the odometer visible. The whole document exists so that neither of you has to remember what the mileage was.
7	BUYER	The buyer's name and address	Their full legal name including suffix and their address, in the lower block. Watch out: Take it off their licence while they are standing there. This sheet has to name a transferee before it means anything at all.
8	BUYER	The buyer acknowledges	Their signature and date on the line headed Buyer Signature Acknowledging Odometer Disclosure. Watch out: Photograph the completed sheet before it leaves with them. You are the other party to a document you both have to keep for four years, and the copy you keep is the one that answers a later dispute.

What gets this one rejected

- Using it when the title's own block is perfectly usable. The V6 is a substitute, and a transaction that arrives with both a completed certification on the certificate and a loose sheet saying something slightly different has manufactured its own discrepancy.
- Tenths of a mile. The reading box takes whole miles, and a figure written with a decimal invites the counter to decide which digits you meant.
- Ticking a discrepancy box to be careful. Only check one of these boxes if the mileage is not correct is the form's own instruction - a tick on a working odometer permanently brands the vehicle's record with a discrepancy that is not true.
- One signature. The form has a buyer signature line acknowledging the disclosure, and it is not optional decoration; an unsigned buyer half leaves the record incomplete.
- Sending it on its own. The form's wording is that it must accompany the transaction - it travels stapled to the title and the application, and posted separately it is a page about a vehicle nobody at the counter is currently looking at.

STATE OF ALASKA DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES Odometer Disclosure Statement

Under **2 AAC 92.220** and **49 CFR Part 580**, federal and state law requires the disclosure of a motor vehicle's odometer reading at the time of sale, transfer, or lease. If the odometer disclosure section is not available or not used on the vehicle's title or Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin (MCO), this form may be completed and must accompany the transaction to properly record the current odometer reading. Failure to complete or provide a false statement may result in fines and/or imprisonment. Both the transferor and the transferee shall retain a legible copy of the odometer disclosure statement for not less than four years.

The provisions of this disclosure statement section shall not apply to the following transfers:

1. A vehicle having an unladen weight of more than 12,000 pounds
2. A vehicle that is not self-propelled
3. A new vehicle prior to it's first transfer for purposes other than resale.
4. A new vehicle sold directly by the manufacturer to any agency of the United States in conformity with contractual specifications.
5. A vehicle that is 10 years old or older until December 31, 2020. As of January 1, 2021, all vehicles that are 20 years old or older starting with the year model 2010. *

*DMV will record the mileage, if known, for vehicles over 20 years old. It is not a requirement of the sale
