

How to fill out CS-L(MVR)202 — Statement of Facts Relating to Junking of Vehicle

Hawaii · written against CS-L(MVR)202 (06/2026), issued under City and County of Honolulu Department of Customer Services, Division of Motor Vehicles, surrendering the certificate of title for cancellation

Some cars are not worth selling, and on Oahu the county will take one off your hands: its junk vehicle programme is free to residents and waives all back registration and fees, which on a car that has sat for years is the largest number in the conversation. This is the statement that does it, and it is a door that only opens one way. You certify that the vehicle has been junked, that it is incapable of safe operation for use on the public highway or has no resale value except as a source of parts or scrap, and - in the form's own capitals - that by junking this vehicle, the vehicle shall never again be titled or registered. The endorsed certificate of title goes in with it, for cancellation.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank CS-L(MVR)202 from the City and County of Honolulu Division of Motor Vehicle, Licensing and Permits at <https://www4.honolulu.gov/docushare/dsweb/Get/Document-326069/hi-mvr202.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	License number and VIN	The identifying pair. The VIN is what the county cancels the record against, so it matters more here than the plate does. Watch out: If the plate has already gone missing, the VIN alone will find the record. Say so in the removal request rather than leaving the plate box blank without explanation.
2	YOU	Make, body type, year model and colour	Four boxes on one line. Colour is asked for here because an inspector has to find the vehicle at the address you give. Watch out: Describe the car as it looks now, not as the registration describes it. A resprayed vehicle that does not match its own paperwork wastes the inspector's visit.
3	YOU	Where the vehicle is	A street address, and the county's own examples tell you how precise to be: address, yard, garage, numbered parking stall. Watch out: A numbered stall or a named carport is what turns an address into a location. An inspector who cannot identify the vehicle cannot write the control number on it.
4	YOU	The certification itself	Not a field - the printed statement you are signing. That the vehicle is incapable of safe operation or has no resale value except as parts or scrap, and that it shall never again be titled or registered. Watch out: Read the capitals before you sign. There is no undo, and a car with a buyer waiting is not a car to put through this form.
5	YOU	Printed name and signature of registered owner	The first signature block, closing the statement of facts. Two copies with wet original signatures are required. Watch out: Sign both copies by hand. Printing one signed sheet twice is exactly what the instruction under the heading exists to prevent.
6	YOU	The request for removal, if you want it	The lower half. Four conditions are printed above it, from no rubbish in the vehicle to at least two inflated tires on the accessible end. Watch out: Skip this half entirely if you are having the vehicle collected privately. Signing it commits you to conditions you may not be planning to meet.
7	YOU	Name, signature, address and telephone numbers	The removal request's own block, with home and business telephone numbers in separate boxes. Watch out: Give a number that will be answered. The inspector's visit and the contractor's six-week window both depend on someone being reachable.
8	OTHER	Page two, official use only	Plates received, by whom and on what date, approved by, and a remarks panel. The county completes all of it. Watch out: The plates-received line is the county's record that you handed the plates in. If you did not, the responsibility for destroying them is yours.

What gets this one rejected

- One copy. The instruction under the heading is that two copies are submitted, wet signature signed originals - a printed scan of a signed sheet is not one of them.
- An unendorsed certificate. The title must be endorsed by all registered owners and by the lienholder if applicable, with the odometer reading completed, before it is surrendered for cancellation.
- Junking a vehicle you intend to sell for parts to a buyer who wants to rebuild it. The certificate is cancelled and the vehicle can never again be titled or registered - there is no route back.
- Asking the City to remove a vehicle parked somewhere it may not be. The county will not remove a vehicle parked illegally on a public street or property, or on private property not owned by the applicant without the owner's written permission.
- Forgetting the plates. If the last issued license plates are not surrendered, the owner is responsible to ensure their destruction.

(Submit 2 copies – Wet Signature Signed Originals)

I, the undersigned owner of the motor vehicle described as:

 (ADDRESS, YARD, GARAGE, NUMBERED PARKING STALL, ETCETERA)

and that said vehicle is incapable of safe operation for use on the public highway and/or has no resale value except as a source of parts or scrap only. **I UNDERSTAND THAT BY JUNKING THIS VEHICLE, THE VEHICLE SHALL NEVER AGAIN BE TITLED OR REGISTERED.**

Accordingly, the last issued **CERTIFICATE OF TITLE** which has been properly endorsed is herewith surrendered for cancellation. *(The Certificate of Title must be endorsed by all registered owner(s) and lienholder, if applicable, and odometer reading completed. If the last issued license plates are not surrendered, the owner is responsible to ensure its destruction).*

REQUEST REMOVAL OF A JUNKED VEHICLE

The undersigned owner of the above described vehicle located at the address noted in the **STATEMENT OF FACTS RELATING TO JUNKING OF VEHICLE** section above, hereby requests that the City and County of Honolulu remove said vehicle which has been junked.

I understand that the following conditions must exist before the City will remove my vehicle:

1. There will be no debris or rubbish in the vehicle;
2. The vehicle must be easily accessible for the tow truck to remove;
3. The vehicle must have at least **two inflated tires**, either front or rear, depending on which end is accessible to the tow truck; and
4. The vehicle is parked on property owned by the applicant or legally parked on a public street or property.

I understand that if the vehicle is parked illegally on a public street or property, or if parked on private property **NOT** owned by the applicant and without written permission by the owner, the City will not remove said vehicle.

I agree to place the NOTICE form, CS-L(MVC) 50, in my vehicle so that it will be visible from outside to inform any agency that the vehicle has been turned over to the City for removal.

Lastly, I understand that a Motor Vehicle Control inspector will inspect the vehicle to insure that it meets the above stated conditions; the inspector will initiate a report with the control number written on the vehicle to identify it for removal by the derelict vehicle contractor within six weeks; and if any additional information is required, I will call the Motor Vehicle Control Section at **(808) 768-2530**.
