

How to fill out 78-015 — Odometer Disclosure Statement

Mississippi · written against 78-015 (Rev(09/7)), issued under the federal and state mileage-disclosure laws its own banner invokes

The standalone mileage certification for when the certificate cannot carry one - an out-of-state title on its way in, a certificate whose disclosure block is already used, or a transfer where the paperwork needs its own signed statement. One page, one number, two exception statements, and both parties' signatures. The Department's registration checklist asks for exactly this sheet alongside a title from another state.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank 78-015 from the Mississippi Department of Revenue, Motor Vehicle Services at <https://www.dor.ms.gov/sites/default/files/tax-forms/motor-vehicle/78015178%2520Odometer%2520Disclosure%2520Statement.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Your name, into the certification	Your name in the opening blank: I, (name), state that the odometer now reads... Watch out: Use the name the certificate's face uses. This sheet travels with the title into the same application, and the county matches names across everything it takes.
2	YOU	The reading, no tenths	Whole miles off the dashboard, into the box the banner has been warning you about. Watch out: Read it at handover, not the night before. The figure must agree with the assignment on the certificate exactly - two documents, one number.
3	YOU	The two statements - usually neither	Check (1) only for a rolled-over odometer, (2) only when the reading genuinely is not the mileage. Watch out: Statement (2) prints WARNING - ODOMETER DISCREPANCY for a reason: it follows the vehicle onto its next title and every one after.
4	YOU	The vehicle band	Make, model, body type, VIN and year, copied from the certificate. Watch out: Copy the VIN from the title rather than the door jamb - if the two disagree you have a bigger problem than mileage, and better to find it now.
5	YOU	Sign, print, address, date	Transferor's signature and printed name, your street, city or town, state and ZIP, and the date of statement. Watch out: The date of statement should be the date of sale. A mileage certified days before handover invites the question of who drove the gap.
6	BUYER	The transferee's half	The buyer signs, prints their name, enters it again exactly as it appears on the title assignment, and adds their address. Watch out: That as-it-appears instruction is the form doing the county's cross-checking in advance - make the buyer bring the certificate over and copy from it.

What gets this one rejected

- Tenths written into the reading. The form says NO TENTHS beside the box; an odometer figure with a decimal in it is the classic way to make five digits read as six.
- A transferee name that does not match the assignment. The form's own capitals instruct that the name be entered as it appears on the certificate of origin or title - a nickname here against a legal name there is a discrepancy on a document about discrepancies.
- Only one signature. The certification is the seller's, but the acknowledgement is the buyer's, and the sheet has a signature line for each because it proves nothing with one.
- Checking statement (2) to be helpful. It brands the vehicle's mileage as not actual on the record, permanently - it is for genuine discrepancies, not for hedging.
- Leaving the date of statement empty. The mileage is a reading at a moment; without the date the number floats free of the sale it certifies.
