

How to fill out Parts Bill of Sale — Parts Vehicle Bill of Sale

Nebraska · written against Parts Bill of Sale (4/2018), issued under Neb. Rev. Stat. s. 60-142; the sole transfer document for a vehicle with a junked status entry on the record

The document for selling a car that is no longer a car. Its header states its two lawful uses: transfer of a vehicle when the title has been surrendered to the Nebraska DMV as evidenced by a junked status entry on the vehicle record, or surrendered to any other state's DMV to render the vehicle fit for sale for scrap and parts only. A junked Nebraska vehicle has no certificate to assign - the title died with the surrender - so this bill of sale is the whole conveyance: date, price, both parties, the vehicle, an odometer certification, and a seller's signature the form itself says must be notarized. The closing warning names the price of stretching it: using this form for a vehicle that does not meet the parts-vehicle definition can mean a fine or imprisonment or both, and s. 60-142 makes it a Class III misdemeanor.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank Parts Bill of Sale from the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles, Driver and Vehicle Records Division at https://dmv.nebraska.gov/sites/dmv.nebraska.gov/files/doc/dvr/forms/billofsale_parts.pdf — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Confirm the record says junked	The form's authority is a junked status entry on the vehicle record - the state of the record, not your recollection of surrendering the title. Watch out: If you are not certain the surrender was ever processed, ask a county counter before selling. The form used on a vehicle that still has a live title is the misuse its penalty clause describes.
2	YOU	Date, names and the sum	The date of sale in its box, then your printed name, the price and the purchaser's printed name in the operative sentence. Watch out: Scrap prices move with the metal market, but the figure still gets written - an acknowledged receipt for three hundred dollars beats a handshake for roughly whatever it weighs.
3	YOU	The vehicle row	Year, make, model and the full VIN. Watch out: Read the VIN off the dash or door plate since there is no title to copy from - it is the number that connects this sale to the junked record.
4	YOU	Both identity columns, addresses and all	Your full name, residential address, mailing address, city-state-zip and phone; the purchaser's same five entries in their column. Watch out: The purchaser's column is your trace on the hulk. A buyer reluctant to give a residential address is telling you something worth hearing before the winch starts.
5	YOU	The odometer certification, honestly	Your printed name, the reading as the dead dial shows it, and an exception box where one is true. Watch out: Not actual is the routine answer on a parts vehicle with a broken cluster, and checking it costs nothing here - this record is not going back on a title.
6	YOU	Sign in front of a notary; the purchaser signs beside you	The seller's line carries the printed requirement - must be notarized - and any notary or designated county official serves. Watch out: Do the notary stop before the buyer arrives with the trailer, or meet at a bank. The stamp is the step this form will not run without.
7	YOU	Then claim the registration back	Plates, decals and the registration certificate go to the county treasurer with the Application for Refund within sixty days of the junking. Watch out: Dismantlement and junking sit in the refund statute's own list of qualifying events - the money does not care that the car left on a trailer.

What gets this one rejected

- Using it on a car that still has a title. A vehicle with a live Nebraska certificate transfers on that certificate; this form exists only after the title has been surrendered and the record shows junked status.
- Using it to sell a runner cheaply. The definition is not about price or condition of sale - it is about a surrendered title and a scrap-and-parts-only record, and the misuse penalty is printed on the form's last lines.
- An unnotarised seller signature. The label under the line is explicit where the ordinary bill of sale is silent: must be notarized. A parts sale signed at the tailgate without a stamp is not complete.
- Skipping the odometer block because the car will never drive again. The certification is printed on the form and completed like any other - with the discrepancy box doing honest work on a cluster that died before the engine did.
- Expecting the buyer to put it back on the road with this paper. A junked vehicle's route back to a title - where one exists at all - runs through inspection and the department, not through a bill of sale.
