

Swears that two versions of a name belong to one person. Used when the name on the title does not match the name on your licence — a maiden name, a dropped middle initial, a nickname the dealer typed, a suffix that came and went.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank VP 185 from the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles at <https://dmv.nv.gov/pdfforms/vp185.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Your full legal name	The opening line: "I, ___ hereby swear under penalty of NRS 482.545". Watch out: Your name as it is now, matching the identification you will show. The other version goes further down.
2	YOU	I reside at	Physical address, then city, state and ZIP on the line beneath. Watch out: Where you live. The DMV compares it against its record for you.
3	YOU	My mailing address is	Where post reaches you, then city, state and ZIP. Watch out: "Same as physical" is a complete answer when they match.
4	YOU	I, ___ am the same person as	Your name again, on the numbered line 3. Watch out: This repeats deliberately. The sentence only works if both halves are filled — your current name here, the other name on the line below.
5	YOU	The other name	The name this one has to be matched to. Watch out: Copy it letter for letter off the document that carries it, and say where it appears — "the name printed on the face of the title" removes any doubt about which mismatch you are clearing.
6	YOU	Licence number, date of birth or FEIN	Nevada driver's licence or ID card number. Watch out: A business swearing this uses its FEIN, and the authorized representative signs.
7	YOU	County, date, signature and notary stamp	The bottom block. Watch out: An authorized Nevada DMV representative can witness it at the counter, which saves finding a notary if you are going in anyway.

- What gets this one rejected**
- Using it to change a name. It does not change anything — it states that two existing names are one person. An actual name change is a different process with different evidence.
 - Naming two genuinely different people. Both names have to be yours; joint owners are not "one and the same".
 - Leaving the second name vague. Write the other name exactly as it appears on the document that carries it.
 - Signing before the notary. Same rule as every affidavit in this family.
