

Turns a wrecked car's ordinary title into a salvage title, or into a non-repairable certificate if it is going to be crushed or parted out. Most people meet this because an insurer totalled their car and they kept it — and until the paper matches the vehicle, nobody can legally buy it from you.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank VP 213 from the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles at <https://dmv.nv.gov/pdfforms/vp213.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	DEALER	Business applicant block	Business name, Nevada DMV business licence number or FEIN, addresses and contact details. Watch out: An insurance company, licensed Nevada business, wrecker or recycler fills this in. A private owner leaves every line of it empty.
2	YOU	Your full legal name	The individual block: your name as it appears on your identification. Watch out: It has to match the name endorsed on the title you are attaching. If the title is in a maiden name, that mismatch gets cleared with VP 185 before this is filed.
3	YOU	Your addresses	Physical Nevada address, then mailing address if it differs. Watch out: The form asks specifically for a physical Nevada address. A PO box belongs on the mailing line.
4	YOU	Telephone and email	Split across three boxes for the number, then the email line. Watch out: Salvage applications generate questions more often than ordinary transfers. A number the DMV can reach saves a fortnight.
5	YOU	Signature and date	The applicant signs and dates. Watch out: Sign as the individual applicant, on the individual line. There is a separate date box beside the business signature that is not yours.
6	YOU	Vehicle Identification Number	One character per box. Watch out: Take it off the title you are surrendering, and check it against the car. A wrecked vehicle is exactly where a transposed VIN goes unnoticed until it is too late.
7	YOU	Year, make and model	The vehicle description. Watch out: Copy it from the title rather than from the insurer's total-loss letter. Insurers abbreviate; the DMV matches against its own record.
8	YOU	What you are applying for	Total loss, flood damaged, non-repairable, or duplicate. Watch out: Read the difference before you tick. Non-repairable means the vehicle will never be registered again, and that is a one-way door.

What gets this one rejected

- Filling in both applicant blocks. One applicant, one block — a private owner completes the individual half only.
- Sending it without the title. The form is explicit: the original, properly endorsed Certificate of Title and any other required documents must be attached for the vehicle listed.
- Ticking non-repairable when you mean salvage. A non-repairable certificate is for a vehicle that will never go back on the road; it cannot be reversed into a salvage title later because you changed your mind.
- Applying on a vehicle already titled non-repairable in another state. The category travels with the vehicle.
- Assuming a salvage title kills the sale. It does not — it changes who buys it and at what price, which is a different problem from an unsellable car.
