

How to fill out TDMV 108 — Affidavit of Sale for a Mechanics Lien or Storage Fees

The garage's form, not the owner's - and the one document in this group that carries a notary block on its face. A repair shop or storage yard that has not been paid can sell the vehicle under RSA chapter 450, and this affidavit is the sworn record of the notices it gave before doing so. A vehicle owner who finds out their car has been sold out from under them should read it as a checklist of what was supposed to have happened.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank TDMV 108 from the New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles at <https://www.dmv.nh.gov/sites/g/files/ehbemt416/files/inline-documents/tdmv108.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	OTHER	Who is swearing	The garage or storage yard, and where it is. Watch out: If you are the owner reading a copy of this, check that the business named is the one that actually held your car.
2	OTHER	Paragraph 1, the lien itself	Storage or labour, the vehicle, the amount, and the date it has been unpaid since. Watch out: The date since when it has remained unpaid is the start of everything else on the page. Every notice date after it has to make sense against it.
3	OTHER	Paragraph 2, the posting	The date and the locations the notice of public sale was posted in. Watch out: Locations, plural, and named. A blank line here is a blank in a sworn statement.
4	OTHER	Paragraph 3, the publication	The date and the newspaper, print or internet. Watch out: An owner disputing a lien sale usually starts here, because a publication is a public record that either exists on that date or does not.
5	OTHER	Paragraph 4, the three searches	Verified mail, return receipt requested, to the Department of Safety, the town or city clerk and the Secretary of State, and what came back. Watch out: This is the paragraph that is supposed to find you. If your name and address were on the title record, they were returned by the first of those three enquiries.
6	OTHER	Paragraph 5, notice to the owner	That the owners and lienholders were told of the sale and of the amount, by verified mail, on a stated date. Watch out: Return receipt requested means there is a receipt. Ask to see it.
7	OTHER	Signature and the jurat	The lienholder signs, then a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace completes the sworn-to-and-subscribed block. Watch out: New Hampshire treats a Justice of the Peace as an alternative to a notary throughout, so the empty seal box does not have to be filled by a notary specifically.

What gets this one rejected

- An unnotarised affidavit. The instruction is printed in bold at the head of the form: affidavit must be completed in full and notarized.
- A blank left anywhere. Completed in full means completed in full, and each numbered paragraph is a separate sworn fact.
- Ordinary post instead of verified mail. Paragraphs 4 and 5 both specify verified mail, return receipt requested.
- A publication date that does not sit before the sale, or a posting with no locations named.
