

How to fill out TDMV 111 — Voided Assignment Letter

What you file when the assignment on the back of the certificate has been crossed out, written over or erased. New Hampshire allows exactly one assignment between non-dealers, so a spoiled entry is not a false start - it is a certificate that now needs a signed explanation behind it. Eight tick-box reasons, an 'other' line, and a signature under penalty of unsworn falsification.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank TDMV 111 from the New Hampshire Division of Motor Vehicles at <https://www.dmv.nh.gov/sites/g/files/ehbemt416/files/inline-documents/tdmv111.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Date and your printed name	The two boxes at the top of the letter. Watch out: The date is the date you are writing the letter, not the date of the spoiled assignment.
2	YOU	Year, make and identification number	Enough to tie the letter to the certificate. Watch out: Copy the identification number off the front of the certificate rather than off the assignment you have just made a mess of.
3	YOU	Tick the reason	One of the eight, or Other with an explanation. Watch out: If two of them are true, use Other and say so in a sentence. A letter with two boxes ticked invites a question you will have to answer by post.
4	YOU	Explain, if you ticked Other	The explanation line, plus the two full-width rules at the foot if you need them. Watch out: Plain and short. The Bureau is deciding whether to accept a certificate with a crossing-out on it, not reading a narrative.
5	YOU	Sign	Every owner named on the certificate signs, under penalty of unsworn falsification. Watch out: Original ink, as always in New Hampshire - no facsimile and no stamp.
6	YOU	Get hold of TDMV 17A	The assignment form the note on this letter says must be completed and submitted with it. Watch out: You cannot download it. A town or city clerk or a New Hampshire licensed dealer has them, and it is worth asking for it in the same visit that produced the problem.

What gets this one rejected

- A letter with no reason ticked and nothing written on the other line.
- A letter sent on its own. The note printed on the form says an assignment of title, form TDMV 17A, shall be completed and submitted with this letter.
- One signature where the certificate names two owners - the signature line is plural.
- An unsigned letter, which is the whole document. There is nothing else on the page that carries weight.

NOTE: Assignment of title, form TDMV 17A shall be completed and submitted with this letter. However, dealer will use the available assignment spaces on the back of the title or Certificate of Origin.

PENALTY (RSA 262:1):

A PERSON WHO, WITH FRAUDULENT INTENT, USES A FALSE OR FICTITIOUS NAME OR ADDRESS, OR MAKES A MATERIAL FALSE STATEMENT, OR FAILS TO DISCLOSE A SECURITY INTEREST, OR CONCEALS ANY OTHER MATERIAL FACT, IN AN APPLICATION FOR A CERTIFICATE OF TITLE, OR IN ANY PROOF OR STATEMENT IN WRITING, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, SHALL BE GUILTY OF A CLASS B FELONY IF A NATURAL PERSON, OR GUILTY OF A FELONY IF ANY OTHER PERSON.
