

How to fill out MVD-11103 — Salvage Vehicle or Vessel Notification

New Mexico · written against MVD-11103 (INT. 01/91), issued under NMSA 1978 §66-3-10.1

The form that puts the word Salvage on a record for good. Filed by the insurance company - or by the owner, if self-insured - it declares the vehicle a total loss under one of three printed scenarios: stolen and never recovered, stolen and recovered, or wrecked or damaged, each with its date lines. The request it makes is permanent by design: that the division flag the registration and title record as Salvage in accordance with Section 66-3-10.1 of the Motor Vehicle Code, and that every subsequent title carry the Salvage brand.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank MVD-11103 from the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department, Motor Vehicle Division at <https://realfile.tax.newmexico.gov/mvd11103.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	OTHER	Owner block - and the self-insured question	The registered owner's details, with the self-insured box ticked only when no insurer stands behind the loss. Watch out: Self-insured genuinely means self-insured - a fleet or an owner who lawfully carries their own risk. An uninsured wreck is a different conversation, mostly with the owner-retained notice.
2	OTHER	Vehicle, claim and insurer	The vehicle's identification, the insurance claim number, and the company's block if one is involved. Watch out: The claim number is the thread the division can pull to verify the loss - include it even though the box looks optional.
3	OTHER	Date one scenario	Stolen-never-recovered, stolen-and-recovered, or wrecked - with the printed date lines completed for whichever applies. Watch out: The recovered scenario wants both dates. A theft with no recovery date yet belongs in the first scenario, and the brand question waits for the car.
4	OTHER	The certification and signature	The insurer certifies the owner was paid fair market value; the initiator or authorized agent signs, dates, and adds a telephone number. Watch out: An owner signing as self-insured is adopting the whole request - including its permanence. Nothing about this filing is reversible by asking nicely later.

What gets this one rejected

- Filed by an ordinary insured owner. Unless the self-insured box genuinely applies, this notification is the insurance company's to make - the owner's parallel duty runs through the owner-retained notice instead.
- No scenario dated. The three printed situations each carry date lines, and an undated declaration fixes nothing on the record.
- The fair-market certification skipped by an insurer. The paragraph is part of the form: the company certifies the owner was actually indemnified.
- Used to un-brand. This form writes Salvage onto a record; the narrow removal path for stolen-and-recovered vehicles with minimal damage runs through the Vehicle Services Unit in Santa Fe with mechanic and insurer statements, not through this page.
- Confused with a salvage title application. The notification flags the record; the branded ownership document that follows is its own transaction.
- Treated as optional on an out-of-state brand. Any branding from another jurisdiction is carried onto the New Mexico title, and other states' salvage-equivalent brands - salvage, flood or hail damage - are salvage branded here.
