

How to fill out MVR-92H — Affidavit of Facts to Accompany Indemnity Bond

North Carolina · written against MVR-92H (Rev 04/26), issued under N.C. General Statute 20-76

Nine questions, sworn in front of a notary, and the substance of the whole bonded-title application. The instruction across the top is not a suggestion: the following questions must be answered in detail, and any omissions or incomplete answers could result in a delay or denial in the issuance of a title.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank MVR-92H from the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles at <https://www.ncdot.gov/dmv/downloads/Documents/MVR-92H.pdf> — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	The vehicle row	Year, make, body style and VIN. Watch out: Note 1 on the instruction sheet is worth reading first: a 1981 or newer vehicle should have a seventeen-digit VIN, and a shorter one on a newer car is a problem in its own right.
2	YOU	Question 1, how you acquired it	The seller's full name, full address and telephone number. Watch out: If you do not have them, say so and say why here rather than leaving the box empty. A blank reads as an unanswered question; an explanation reads as an answer.
3	YOU	Question 2, the date	The date you acquired the vehicle. Watch out: Approximate it honestly if you have to. A date that conflicts with a document you attach is worse than a month you have described as approximate.
4	YOU	Question 5, outstanding liens	Whether any lien is outstanding, the lienholder's name, and a release attached. Watch out: This is one of the nine refusals in disguise. A bond is not acceptable where there is an outstanding lien for which a cancellation cannot be furnished, so an honest yes here may end the application.
5	YOU	Question 8, why there was no assigned title	The longest box on the form, and an explanation in detail. Watch out: Chronology, names, dates. The Division is being asked to issue a title against a bond and this paragraph is the reason it might.
6	YOU	Question 9, the steps you took	What you did to contact the seller or previous owner. Watch out: Certified letters, county records, the closing attorney, the last known employer — list them with dates. Effort you cannot describe is effort the Division cannot count.
7	YOU	Signature and notary block	Your signature, then date, county, state, the names of the principals, and the notary's signature, printed name, seal and expiry. Watch out: Do this before the inspection appointment, not after. The instruction sheet puts the affidavit at step 1 and the inspection at step 2 for a reason.

What gets this one rejected

- One-word answers. The heading asks for detail and question 8 asks for it again in its own wording.
- Question 9 left thin. Nobody grants a bonded title to somebody who has not tried to find the last owner, and this is where you show that you did.
- A lien named in question 5 with no release attached. The question asks for both.
- No evidence of ownership attached at all. The heading asks you to furnish any document in your possession showing proof of ownership and names examples: a title, a bill of sale, a conditional sales contract, invoices, out-of-state registrations.
- Filling it in after the inspection. NCDMV's instruction sheet says this form has to be completed before the vehicle is inspected, and the inspector wants to see it.
- An unsworn copy. The affidavit is signed in the presence of a notary and the acknowledgment is part of the document.

The following questions must be answered ***in detail*** and this form must be attached to any application for title that is supported by an Indemnity Bond. Furnish any document in your possession showing proof of ownership. (Examples would be a Title, Bill of Sale, Conditional Sales Contract, Invoices, Out of State Registrations).

1. How did you acquire the vehicle? List the seller's full name, full address, and phone number.

Left on the property when I bought 4127 Silas Creek Pkwy from Hobart L. Yancey, address unknown, no phone.

2. List the date you acquired the vehicle. 03/11/2019

3. Is the vehicle currently titled in North Carolina? If no, list the last title state.

Yes - the record shows Hobart L. Yancey, Forsyth County.

4. Does the VIN plate appear on the vehicle? If so, please give the location.

Yes. Driver door jamb and dashboard at the base of the windshield.

5. Are there any liens outstanding on the vehicle? If so, list the lienholder's name and provide a lien release.

No liens shown on the record.

6. Has the vehicle been wrecked? If so, list the major parts replaced.

No. Body and drivetrain are original.

7. If you were given a title at the time of purchase, why can it not be furnished at the present time?

No title was ever provided to me.

8. Explain, ***in detail***, why the seller did not give you a properly assigned title for the vehicle.

The truck was not part of the sale of the house and no bill of sale was written. Mr Yancey left the state before I could reach him and the closing attorney had no forwarding address for him.

9. What steps have you taken to contact the seller/previous owner to obtain proper ownership documentation?

Two certified letters to his last known address, both returned; searched the county tax and probate records; asked the closing attorney.
