

How to fill out ENF-SAL-221-NR — Nonrepairable Motor Vehicle Disclosure

The buyer's written acknowledgement that the car they are taking away can never legally go back on a road - anywhere, ever. It is the harder twin of the salvage disclosure: salvage can be rebuilt and retitled, nonrepairable cannot.

This sheet is not the form. Download the blank ENF-SAL-221-NR from the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles at https://www.txdmv.gov/sites/default/files/form_files/ENF-SAL-221-NR.pdf — always take the current revision from the agency rather than a copy. Print this and keep it beside you while you complete theirs.

Every line, in the order you meet it

1	YOU	Vehicle	Year, make and VIN. Watch out: Fill this in before the buyer arrives. It is the only part of the form that is yours to prepare.
2	BUYER	Purchaser's printed name	The buyer's name, printed into the acknowledgement sentence. Watch out: Read the sentence out loud if you have to. It is doing all the work on this page.
3	YOU	Flood-only box	Ticked only where flood damage is the sole reason for the classification. Watch out: If the car was also wrecked or burned, leave it. The box is about why, not about what happened at some point.
4	BUYER	Purchaser signs and dates	The buyer's signature and the date. Watch out: Keep a copy. Without one you have no evidence the disclosure ever happened.

What gets this one rejected

- The seller signing it. Every line on this form belongs to the purchaser, and it is their acknowledgement that has legal effect.
- Using it for a salvage vehicle. Salvage and nonrepairable are different classifications with different forms - the salvage disclosure is the ENF-SAL-221.
- Ticking the flood box on a car that is nonrepairable for other reasons. The box is explicitly for a vehicle classified nonrepairable based solely on flood damage.
- Handing the car over without one. The disclosure is the point of the exercise, and it happens before the vehicle changes hands.
